A session with the Principal



A live session on the topic “My Strength” was conducted by our Principal, D. P. Guleria, for the students of Class VII. Sir focused on developing Mind Strength, explaining that confidence, resilience, and a positive attitude help us achieve success. He guided students on Time Management, Social Skills, Emotional Skills, Physical Fitness, and Teamwork, which together shape a strong personality.

Sir also spoke about Human Values like Sympathy and Empathy, and explained that emotional behavior is closely linked with social behavior because human beings cannot exist in isolation. He discussed Strengths and Weaknesses, saying that knowing them helps improve Self-Esteem.

To make learning more effective, Sir showed a video of the Tortoise and the Hare, highlighting not only “Slow and steady wins the race” but also that teamwork can lead to better results. He motivated students by saying that improvement is possible at any stage, and that skills can be learned at any age if we work on them continuously.

The session was highly motivating and helped students understand how to build their inner strength and move confidently towards success.

Sir D.P. Guleria is more than a principal — he’s someone who continues to guide you long after you leave school.
