### FREEDOM HONoured, RESPONSIBILITY EMBRACED

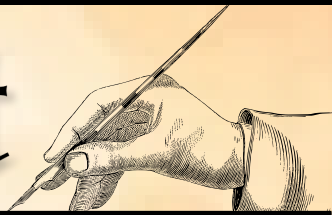

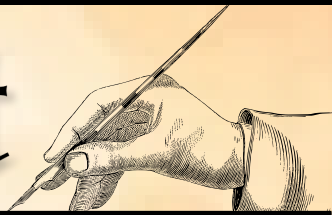


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## EVE OF INDEPENDENCE

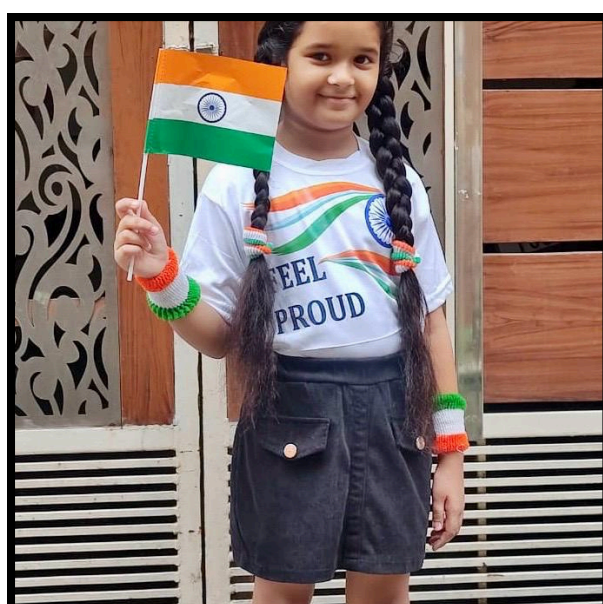
### Slogan Writing Competition
